

VILLAGE MATTERS

PROPERTY TAX BYLAW 566-17:

Village Council passed first reading of Tax Bylaw 566-17, second and third reading will be done at the June 21st Council meeting. Residents can expect an increase of 5.5% - 7% based on your assessment. The Village has seen a slight decline over the past years in grants and transfers and an increase in operational costs which left council with few choices but to raise the mill rate by 1.5%.

CURB STOP REPLACEMENT:

Over the next 2 years PW staff are going to be identifying, marking, operating and mapping every individual curb stop within the Village of Warner's boundaries. Any curb stop not working will be replaced. So, if you the residents see us the Village staff looking and digging around your yard this summer or next we are looking for your curb stop.

INFRASTRUCTURE PROJECTS:

The Village of Warner has had several MSI projects approved and funded by Municipal Affairs. In June, the water line looping project from 5th Ave. to 7th Ave along 6th St. will get under way. 5 new Sewer Lagoon valves were installed in late May, Paving in front of the Church along 3rd street was completed in May, and paving along 5th St. from 4th Ave to 5th Ave is scheduled to be completed this fall. The ice plant at the Arena has been re-built and new gym equipment installed in May. Extension of water and sewer lines from 1st Ave. to Park Ave has also been approved and the design work is also complete making this project possible this fall as well. Council will also be discussing were to spend the Gas Tax Funds (\$50,000+) at their next meeting.

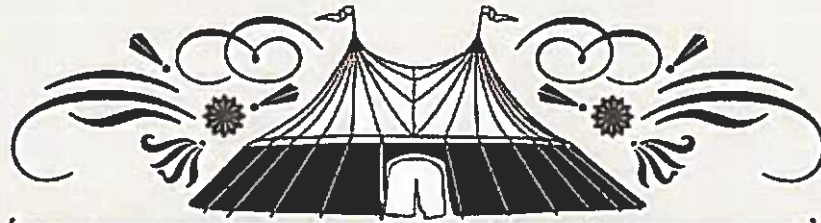

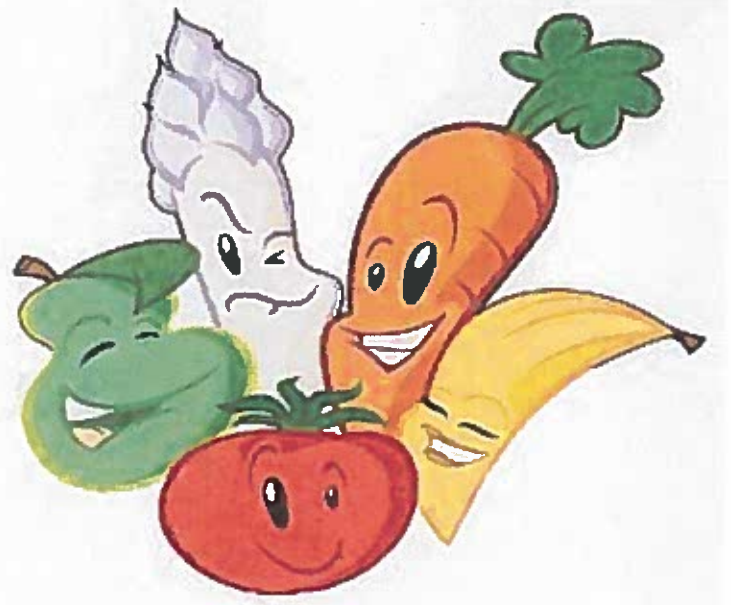

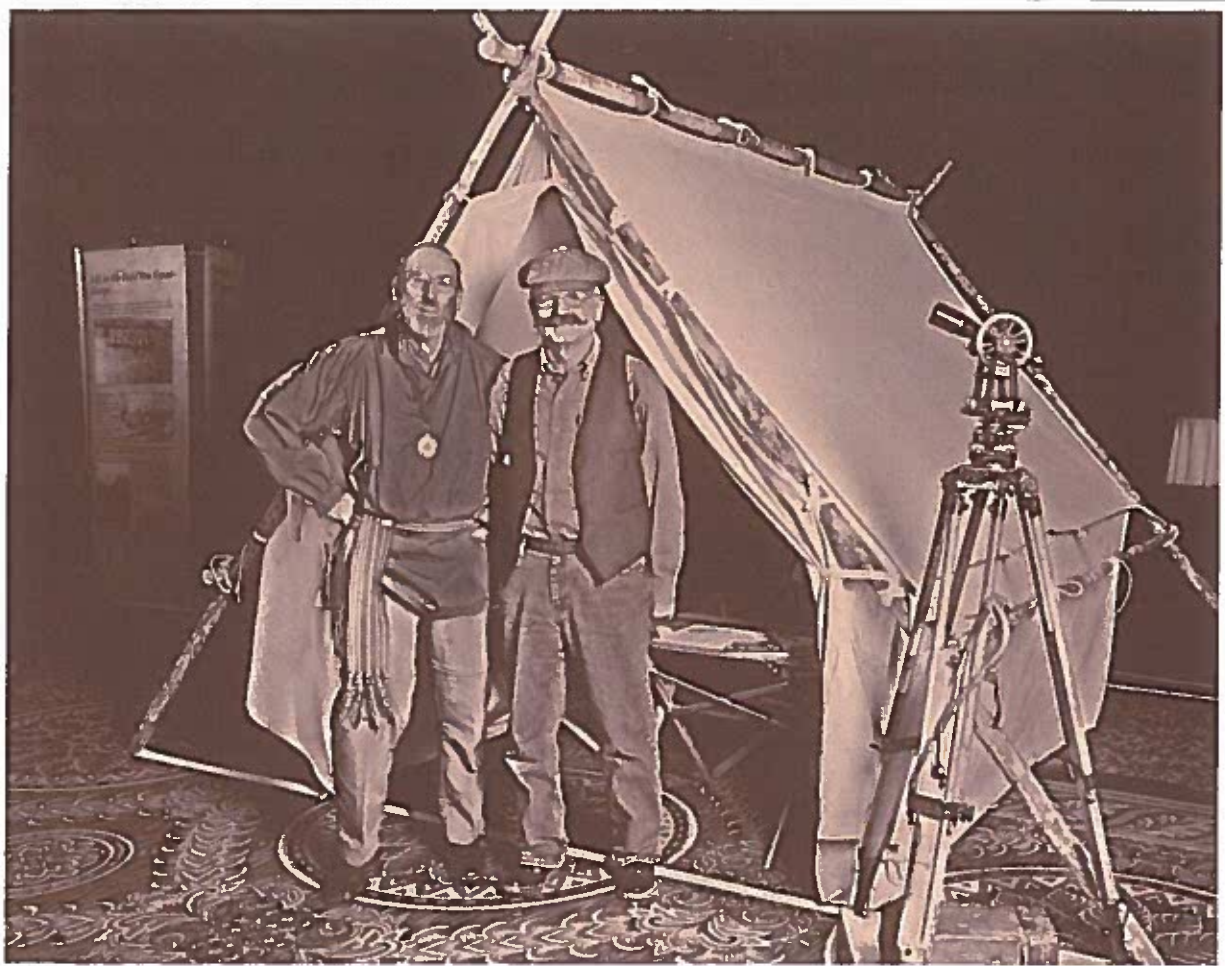
