Village Council News February 2020

Council Business: BORROWING BYLAW 565-20:

Council has given the Borrowing Bylaw 565-20 second reading at the January 15th, 2020 council meeting. This bylaw will be on the February 19th council meeting agenda for third and final reading. The purpose of this Bylaw is to allow the Village to borrow money if needed to cover expenditures until taxes start to be received by the Village. Very similar to your own personal line of credit or overdraft account. In the past 3 years the Village has not needed this line of credit but it is required to have the Bylaw in place just in case we need to borrow the money.

CAPITAL & OPERATING BUDGETS 2020 - 2023

With the changes to the MGA council now needs to develop a 3-5-year capital & operating budgets starting this year. Council is putting the finishing touches on the capital plan which is funded by the provincial MSI program. We have been assured that the funding will continue but we have experienced cutbacks in funding and this does impact our ability to do larger projects in the coming years. The operating budget will also be difficult to predict with increasing carbon costs, policing, school requisitions going up but council is mandated by the provincial government to get it done so we will do our best.

Village council is in discussions with Milk River council with regards to sharing a CAO and working towards more cooperation between the 2 municipalities. These discussions are ongoing with both councils being very positive about the future possibilities of more shared services thus reducing some of the costs to each municipality. This cooperation is viewed very positively by the provincial government as well and may be the way forward for small rural municipalities, survival by cooperation and collaboration.

BULK WATER RATES:

Council approved a rate increase to the bulk water, going from \$1.00 for 700 liters to \$2.00 for 1000 liters effective January 1st, 2020.

I was asked the other day by a local resident, "where do the taxes go? I can't see anything that accounts for all the taxes that I pay!!!

I will try to answer that question. Most of the money that is collected is spent on the services, and infrastructure that we all enjoy. Such as good clean drinking water, waste water management, roads and road maintenance, snow plowing, snow removal, grading, gravelling roads, street lights, policing, bylaw enforcement, fire, emergency response, garbage pickup, recycling, waste transfer site , parks maintenance, recreation at the Civic Centre, fitness room, Library, Land Use Planning, development services and your tax dollars also help support the many service clubs in the Village along with some of the social services offered in the Village and much more.

These services benefit ALL the residents, and those who don't pay their taxes are being subsidizing by those who do. The Village sends out Tax notices and expects everyone to pay their fair share.

The Government takes their requisitions for School, Seniors & starting this year the new policing costs right out of our account and we have to pay it, whether or not all residents pay their taxes, this costs all of us thousands every year but the Provincial Legislation (MGA) makes us wait 2 years before we can start tax arrears action.
